Honoree, Marie McDonald, is one of Hawai'i's
most respected kupuna in the arts of lei and
kapa-making. Her contemporary kapa are the
result of years of research, honoring a
meaningful, yet often unsung, artform. The
master kapa maker spent most of her childhood
on Moloka'i and is descended from families of
two great cultural traditions: on her mother's

side, the Mahoe line of Hawaiian chiefs; on her father's side, the distinguished Adams family of New England.
