DESCRIPTION: DOUBLE STRAND FEATHER LEI

Two attached strands which form a pattern of alternating yellow and green bands between them. Three sections of yellow feathers from the 'O'o bird and three sections of green feathers from the 'O'u bird on each strand, held together by a tuft of yellow feathers. Feathers are tied to cord of olona fiber, which is now tied at ends to black grosgrain ribbon.
